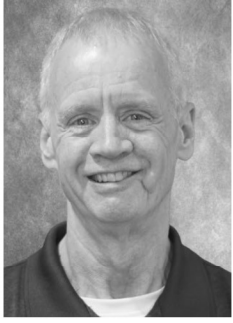

A WORD FROM PASTOR JEFF Easter for Ordinary Saints

The church does something wonderfully impractical every spring. After the sober honesty of Lent—ashes on our foreheads and the uncomfortable truth that we are dust—the church bursts into Easter and keeps going for fifty whole days. Not just one Sunday, but a week of Sundays. On Easter morning we hear that Christ is risen, and we nod politely, sing an Easter hymn, and go home to leftover ham and the same old worries waiting for us on Monday morning. Resurrection sounds amazing in the sanctuary, but the world outside still looks stubbornly the same. Which is why the church keeps dragging us back to the empty tomb. That is the heart of the gospel the Lutheran tradition loves to proclaim: God acts precisely where we have run out of possibilities. Resurrection is not a reward for strong faith or heroic discipleship. It is sheer gift—God’s stubborn refusal to abandon the world God loves. In baptism, the church says something just as audacious. We tell dripping wet infants and skeptical adults alike that they have already been joined to Christ’s death and resurrection. Before they have done a single good work, before they have figured out what faith even looks like, God claims them. And slowly, sometimes almost imperceptibly, the resurrection begins to reshape ordinary life. A forgiven sinner tries again. A weary congregation keeps serving its neighbors. None of it looks particularly dramatic. But make no mistake: this is resurrection at work. Easter is not just a past event we remember once a year. It is the quiet revolution God has already begun in Christ—a revolution that reaches even into our daily work, our families, our congregations, and the small corners of the world God has entrusted to us. Christ is risen. Which means the future does not belong to death, despair, or our failures. The future belongs to the God who keeps raising the dead—and who, in mercy, has promised to raise us too.

Please join us in celebrating a very special double retirement!

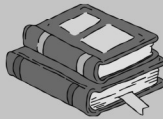

PRODIGAL SONS CLASS



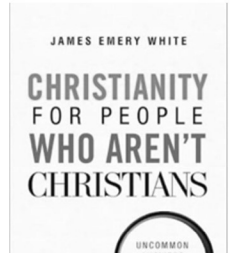
