




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A WORD FROM PASTOR PAM

COUNCIL CORNER

On Thursday, December 18 we had a forum where we discussed some exciting changes that are going to happen with our Pastoral staff this January.

Not everyone could join us so I will summarize the changes here.

The need for Pastoral visits is increasing as we get older. When Pastor Kim and Pastor Steve retired, the number of Pastors went from three to two. It has been a struggle to meet the need for visits. This has been stressful for the Pastors and those in need.

One of our members has given us a generous gift to be used where our need is greatest, and it was decided that visitation was that need. We learned that we have a retired Pastor living in Sun City West who enjoys connecting with people and had asked God where he could be of help. He is Pastor Lowell Nelson who last served as the senior pastor at American Lutheran in Sun City. He will be joining us this January half-time with visitation as his primary duties.

Pastor Jeff Hackler has been with us almost two years as a bridge pastor until a new senior pastor is found. We all thought that it would only be a few months. Pastor Jeff is of retirement age and deserves more personal time. He has asked to be half time beginning this January. He will continue his preaching and teaching schedule. We are working with another retired pastor to further enhance visitation with Pastor Jeff going half-time.

We now will have one full time Pastor and three part time Pastors. There is a need to coordinate their duties. The Congregational Council and staff need to have a Pastor that can decide when the need arises. A Lead Pastor would fill these situations. The Council has added these duties to Pastor Pam Reynolds. She will be our Lead Pastor until our new Senior Pastor arrives.

These changes will not affect our process of calling a new Senior Pastor. The Call Committee is continuing their duties. The changes will be budget neutral.

Our God meets our needs in mysterious ways and not according to our timetable. Praise our Lord and Savior.

NADABURG SCHOOL SUPPLIES NEEDED



The Nadaburg Unified School District #81 is a K-12 school district in the town of Wittman, AZ. It operates two elementary schools: Nadaburg Elementary (the historical school in the town) as well as Desert Oasis Elementary in the Surprise city limits; eight miles from LOL. Nadaburg also operates Mountainside High School. Lord of Life has a long history of providing volunteers who tutor students and gather schools supplies for the classroom teachers to aid in their teaching.

More than 75% of the students in this district receive free or reduced lunches daily, which is an indication of the poverty level in the district. JANUARY GRATITUDE GIFT: FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN (FMSC)

FMSC provides specially enriched food packs Manna packs to children throughout the world. LOL has sponsored mobile packs for 7 years. **We will again host a mobile pack in February 2026. We plan to pack 171,000 meals over the course of 2 days, February 20 & 21.** You can feed a child for a year for only \$106 or a family for a year for \$424. Please give generously to keep at least one child from going to bed hungry. Every dollar contributed goes directly to FMSC.

FMSC is a highly efficient and effective charity, earning 4 stars from Charity Navigator for 19 years running. They get remarkable results by providing a scientifically designed food formula, enriched with vitamins and minerals, packaged in easy-to-ship plastic bags. Costs are kept low by using volunteers to pack the bags and the shipping boxes and by partnering with hundreds of food distribution groups to get the packs into the hands of the needy in over 70 countries. 99.8% of all meals shipped arrived at their destination. More than 90% of funds raised are spent directly on meal production. In 2023/2024 FMSC provided 448 million meals that fed 1,227,478 children. 1,162,560 people volunteered in the US.



1. What was your favorite part of the Holidays?

The holidays are full of great moments, but my favorite part had to be all the wonderful smells – even here in Arizona! From desert breezes mixed with fresh cookies to pine-scented wreaths and peppermint treats, my nose was very busy. Cooler mornings made it the perfect time for extra walks and lots of sniffing, which is always at the top of my list.

2. How should people approach you at church?

A calm and gentle approach is always best. Please speak softly, move slowly, and ask before petting me. I enjoy meeting new friends, but I also take my work seriously. After all, I'm not just a friendly face – I'm on duty and doing my best to serve with focus and grace.

3. You went through a lot of training to become a service and therapy dog. What's been the most difficult thing?

My training taught me many important skills, but the hardest part was learning when to stay completely focused – especially in a place full of interesting distractions. In Arizona, that can include birds, lizards, and the occasional squirrel darting across the path. Patience was another big lesson, especially when people move slowly or children get excited.
