A WORD FROM PASTOR JEFF

Advent is the season of the church that teaches us to wait, something I'm afraid that we modern people are not very good at. In a world addicted to immediate gratification, Advent reminds us that God moves at a different pace. We live in a culture that despises waiting. Fast food, fast WI-FI, fast news - we have built an empire on instant everything. But Advent forces us to lean into God's time - four weeks to take time and to mark time differently from the way the world keeps

time. The church gives us these four weeks, not as a countdown to Christmas, but as a time to learn again how to hope, how to watch, how to wait. Advent is the season that refuses to let us rush to Bethlehem without first standing still long enough to reflect on the sin of a world that needs saving.

Advent is not about pretending the darkness isn't real. It's about daring to believe that the light is on its way. And so we light the Advent candles against the darkness of this world remembering that the church stands in the tension between promise and fulfillment, fear and faith. We pray, "Come, Lord Jesus" knowing that things are not yet as they should be, and in the hope of believing that one day they will be.

So here we are - waiting again. Waiting not for Santa or sentiment, but for a savior. The one who came once in humility as the babe of Bethlehem and the one who will come again in glory. The one who refuses to leave the world as it is. So, this season of Advent, light your candles, sing your hymns, pray your prayers. But don't get too comfortable. Jesus is coming, and when he arrives, he tends to turn everything upside down.

COUNCIL CORNER

In September the Congregational Council appointed an Architectural Committee to evaluate the future and immediate needs of the Sanctuary and Narthex which includes the restrooms.

The question most would ask is "are they nuts?" They have been asking the congregation to increase their giving to meet our obligations and now they want to spend more?

These are some of the reasons why:

- The building is forty years old and other than an organ replacement, there have been no significant facelifts or improvements. There aren't many homes in our community where some remodeling and refreshment hasn't been done.
- We need to have a vision of the future and improve our welcome to the community. The outdated narthex doesn't provide that welcoming vibe.
- It is clear we need to update the restrooms in the narthex. The Narthex needs to be more welcoming and functional.
- We need to evaluate storage spaces. Current storage spaces are inadequate and difficult to access.

There are no plans to do a fund appeal or divert monies from our operating expenses. It may happen in the future, but there are no plans at this time.

We are very fortunate that one of our members gave us a very large gift from her estate and about one million dollars was set aside for facility renewal. This could be used to pay for some of the immediate needs.

Take time to walk around our campus and be aware of the improvements that have been made in recent years: Ruby Hall, the kitchen, the office space, upgrades to the parking lot lighting, solar panels, corner sign and courtyard. This narthex project is another step in bringing our facilities to the standard that we have enjoyed.

We will keep you updated as things move forward.

The call committee remains committed to finding a pastor who embodies these attributes and demonstrates additional qualities essential to our mission. We believe that the right candidate has already been chosen by God and await His guidance for this individual to join our community.

We respectfully request your continued prayers for the call committee and for God's direction in sending us a new pastor. If you know of a pastor who may be a suitable fit for our congregation, please inform a committee member. Should you have a personal relationship with such a pastor, kindly inquire about their interest in pursuing a new call. If interested, we will notify the Synod Transition team to initiate the interview process.


FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN AND CHILI FEED

NADABURG SCHOOL SUPPLIES NEEDED

The Nadaburg Unified School District #81 is a K-12 school district in the town of Wittman, AZ. It operates two elementary schools: Nadaburg Elementary (the historical school in the town) as well as Desert Oasis Elementary in the Surprise city limits; eight miles from LOL. Nadaburg also operates Mountainside High School. Lord of Life has a long history of providing volunteers who tutor students and gather schools supplies for the classroom teachers to aid in their teaching.

More than 75% of the students in this district receive free or reduced lunches daily, which is an indication of the poverty level in the district. LEGACY OF LOVE FINAL REPORT

On November 15 and 16 a celebration coffee hour was held to thank all who participated in the Legacy of Love Appeal. If you were unable to attend, we wish to share some of the information presented on those days

The original goal was to raise, \$1,500,000 over a three year time frame. The initial designated areas were \$500,000 each for campus refresh, facilities renewal and ministry in the West Valley. Members, past members and friends of Lord of Life turned the hope of the committee into reality.

The statistics from this appeal are as follows: 284 families pledged and 375 families made a donation. The total that was pledged was \$1,646,555.36 and the amount received totaled \$1,616,508.45. The wonderful and amazing fact is we received 98% of the pledged amount!

An additional \$120,749.39 was received through memorials and estate gifts making the grand total \$1,737,257,84. There were campaign expenses such as printing, postage, food for the brunches, consultant and graphic artist fees for the banner, and the Legacy of Love prospectus. This left us with \$1,695,061.01 for projects.

Because the donors said "yes, it is our time and our turn." many projects were able to be completed. Having the sanctuary, social hall, chapel, classrooms and the administration building reroofed, the social hall remodeled, a new corner sign and the courtyard refreshed are just a few of the items accomplished because of the generosity of all. The donors wanted to be a part of leaving a Legacy and they did. They left a Legacy of Love.
