


A WORD FROM PASTOR JEFF Martin Luther


Martin Luther did not set out to become a brand name or a denominational logo. He was a simple monk with an overactive conscience. Luther's problem was not that he thought too much of himself, but that he thought too much of God—God as a vengeful judge with a taste for smiting sinners. He tried to pacify that God by fasting, confessing, punishing his own

body, and climbing the ladder of good works rung by rung, only to discover that the God made known in Jesus is not a God of wrath but a God of mercy. Luther, hunched over his Bible, tripped over a phrase that would not lie still: the righteousness of God. He first heard it as threat—God's righteousness as the standard by which sinners are measured and found wanting. Then, he heard it as gift—God's righteousness given to sinners who have nothing to offer but their empty hands. The gospel, Luther realized, is not good advice about how to climb up to God, but good news that God has come down to us, stubbornly, bodily, in Jesus Christ.

Luther reminds us that the church is always one generation away from forgetting the gospel and substituting something cheaper: morality, nationalism, success, respectability. He calls us back to the scandalous claim that sinners are justified by grace alone, through faith alone, for Christ's sake alone. That is not a slogan for a bumper sticker. It is a word that topples empires and rescues frightened consciences.

We remember Luther not because he was right about everything—he wasn't—but because he was seized by a God who refuses to be bought, managed, or politely admired from a distance. A God who justifies the ungodly. A God who creates a church not out of heroes, but out of forgiven sinners who, like Luther, are surprised to discover that the door to heaven does not open inward, by our effort, but outward, by God's mercy.



He completed the Level II ELCA Coaching certification to strengthen his skill in encouraging individuals, teams and organizations.

If you're feeling extra generous, sharing the love with a local animal shelter or a therapy or service dog organization would make my heart very happy.


As a therapy dog, are you allowed to visit people in the hospital?




