A WORD FROM PASTOR PAM

November is the time in the church year that we honor the "saints who have gone before us". On the first Sunday, known as "All Saints Sunday", we name aloud all of our loved ones who have been "called home" into the loving arms of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We light a candle to remember and honor the ways that they

have touched our lives. It is a time to be intentionally grateful for all the ways that those who have gone on before us have touched our lives. Those whom we will never forget but carry with us in our hearts until we are reunited one day, just as Jesus has promised.

But what does it actually mean to be a saint? Lutherans regard and acknowledge the Saints (you know, the big-name ones), but not in the way that our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters revere them. Lutherans do not believe that we need to pray to an intermediary in order to have our prayers heard by God or that Saints are assigned special guardianship duties over particular matters in our lives. We have access to God because of the loving sacrifice that Jesus Christ made on the cross. We have the promise of life eternal with our God through our baptism and Christ's own resurrection.

So, why then do we acknowledge Saints and, saints (you and me)? Perhaps you didn't know that you are a saint? Luther teaches us that we are all saints and sinners, simultaneously! The Latin phrase is "Simul Justus et Peccator". The meaning is that through our baptism our sins have been cleansed, yes, but we still have the inclination to sin even if we don't act upon it. So, just the fact that we think about things which are sin, makes us sinners, but we are justified by grace through faith. I know, it feels a little circular, but the good news is that in our baptism and by the gift of Jesus' death on the cross, we have been redeemed! When I preside at a funeral this is why I remind the bereaved that we need not refer to our loved one as someone we have "lost." We can take heart and be comforted in knowing that God has already claimed us in our baptism! We do not need to be fearful about where our loved ones are, or what has happened to them. Rest assured, they have only "gone home" where we will one day be reunited with them and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Thanks be to God!



MISSION ENDOWMENT FUND THIRD QUARTER UPDATE

So far this year, the Mission Endowment Fund Committee has recommended, and the Congregational Council has approved, eight grants totaling \$114,490.00. The grant recipients are:

- Benevilla: \$15,000.00 for furniture and IT equipment for the Mary Bovard Center.
- Thrive AZ: \$5,000.00 for furniture for their Family Reunification Room.
- Rainbow Acres: \$10,000.00 for their Ranchers Scholarship Fund.
- Kirurumu Health Center in Tanzania: \$6,500.00 for windows for their new clinic wing.
- Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (PLTS): \$52,200.00 for 3 Scholarships for students preparing to become Pastors.
- University of Arizona Campus Ministry: \$3,000.00 for their Wednesday evening student meals.
- Shepherd of the Desert Lutheran Church: \$12,300.00 for a new Air Conditioner and smart thermostats for their Social Hall.
- Shepherd of the Desert Lutheran Church: \$10,490.00 for Five Community Outreach Programs' Support including a Pancake Breakfast; a Trunk or Treat Event; and Game, Paint and Bingo Nights.

The total grant funds for 2025 are \$119,048.00, leaving \$4,558.00 remaining for distribution this year.

The committee members are: Marcia Steil (Council Rep), Randy Farwell, Gary Kakert, Dean Lewellen and Shirley Marsh. Ex-officio members are Pastor Jeff and Treasurer Ron Guse.
